



Light rail work is continuing in Kensington and Kingsford from 1 February to 1 May 2018

In planning for Tomorrow's Sydney we are building a new light rail line to provide modern, reliable and sustainable public transport that will transform services from Circular Quay and the CBD to Kingsford and Randwick via Surry Hills, Moore Park and Kensington.

What we're doing in Kensington and Kingsford

ALTRAC Light Rail will continue work in the Kensington and Kingsford area.

This notification covers continuing construction activities from 1 February 2018 to 1 May 2018 on Anzac Parade between Dacey Avenue and Sturt Street.

Installation of all track slab on Anzac Parade is nearly complete, with track slab in place from Todman Avenue to the Nine Ways intersection.

Construction activities will focus on kerbside work to underground power and telecommunication services, widen kerbs, install drainage, construction of stops, install footings for new smart poles and restore footpaths.

Work will also continue at the Rainbow Street rail yard. Utility investigation work will continue along the light rail alignment.

Work may at times be subject to further approval and work periods may be extended, due to weather or unforeseen circumstance. Impacted stakeholders will be notified.

Work locations and activities

Construction work and smart pole installation will be carried out in the following locations:

- Anzac Parade, between Dacey Avenue and Todman Avenue (Zone 28)

- Anzac Parade, between Todman Avenue and High Street (Zone 29)
- Anzac Parade, between High Street and Rainbow Street (Zone 30)
- Anzac Parade, between Rainbow Street and Sturt Street (Zone 31)

Site compounds:

- Rainbow Street rail yard
- NIDA carpark on Anzac Parade
- Anzac Parade, north of Boronia Street
- Houston Road, south east corner of Barker Street intersection
- Tay Street Reserve, corner of Anzac Parade and Tay Street

Intersection work will take place at:

- Anzac Parade and Alison Road
- Anzac Parade and Todman Avenue
- Anzac Parade and High Street
- Nine Ways
- Anzac Parade and Sturt Street

Light Rail stop construction will commence at:

- Todman Avenue stop (located north of the Todman Avenue intersection in Zone 28)

Substation work will take place at:

- Anzac Parade, Kingsford Terminus site (zone 31), near Sturt Street

Work may also take place at other intersections, on cross-streets and side streets around the area. Detailed information about intersection work will be provided to impacted stakeholders in advance of the work.

Work times

Work will occur during standard daytime hours to minimise impacts where possible:

- Monday to Friday, 6am to 6pm
- Saturday, 8am to 5pm

Work outside of standard daytime hours is necessary at times for safety and traffic reasons.

Intersection work will take place across continuous day and night shifts during dedicated intersection closures. This will allow work to be completed as quickly as possible, minimising impacts to traffic and nearby residents.

Impacted stakeholders will be notified in advance of out of hours work taking place.

Details of work activities

Construction work: includes movement of site compounds (installation of fencing and barriers, traffic signal, signage and line marking changes, lane closures and traffic changes), road and footpath excavation for utility investigation and property connection works, protection and relocation, drainage work, removal of overhead electrical and communication services, vegetation work (trimming, mulching and removal of shrubs or trees), retaining wall construction, heritage works, road pavement work (asphalt milling and reinstating the pavement), footpath restoration, track work (rail preparation work, concrete pouring, rail delivery, rail/track installation, surveying, welding, saw cutting and surface finishing), transportation and delivery of materials (includes rail deliveries from Rainbow Street rail yard).

Smart poles and street lighting work:

Smart Poles will be installed along the light rail alignment to support the overhead wiring needed to power the light rail vehicles, as well as street lighting.

Existing power and light poles will gradually be removed as smart pole installation progresses. Some electrical and communications connections to properties will be moved underground to make way for the new poles.

Temporary street lighting will be required along Anzac Parade as existing street lights are removed to facilitate the kerbside works. Temporary street lighting will be located within the light rail work site either in the median of Anzac Parade or at the back of the kerb. Permanent street lighting will be reinstated when new poles are installed.

Work will include piling, kerb realignment and street lighting adjustments, awning adjustments, pole footings, and use of temporary street lighting.

Intersection work: includes excavation, utility identification, protection and relocation, removal of hazardous material, track work (includes rail preparation work, concrete pouring, rail delivery, rail/track installation, drainage work surveying, welding, saw cutting and surface finishing), temporary street lighting, traffic signals and signage, and pavement removal and reinstatement.

Light Rail stop construction: includes excavation, steel fixings, concrete pours, installation of conduits, steel structure, cladding, and street furniture, electrical fit out and testing.

Substation work: includes excavation, vegetation work (trimming, mulching and removal of shrubs or trees), utility work, installation of precast concrete walls, electrical fit out, and backfill.

Equipment and vehicles for this work may include radar detection and survey equipment, concrete trucks and pumps, flood lights, vacuum excavation trucks, coring and drilling machines, excavators, cranes, compaction equipment, chainsaws, saw cutters, road grinders, tipper trucks, hand tools, water carts, semi-trailers, piling rigs, spray seal trucks, asphalt pavers, roller, wide-load vehicles (rail delivery) and traffic control vehicles.

How will work affect you?

Traffic and pedestrian changes

Anzac Parade will remain open during all work and two traffic lanes will generally be maintained in both directions.

Temporary footpath closures during kerbside work may be necessary to undertake this work.

Access to buildings and driveways will be maintained. If any interruption to property access is required, it will be discussed with impacted stakeholders well ahead of time.

Traffic control will be in place to direct motorists and pedestrians safely around the operations. Access for emergency services will be maintained at all times.

Localised traffic management will be in place to assist motorists, pedestrians and cyclists with the new traffic arrangements.

Cyclists are recommended to use detours away from Anzac Parade during construction.

Noise and dust

You may experience some noise and vibration during this work. Efforts will be made to schedule the noisiest work during the daytime and evening.

Noise monitoring will be conducted and, where practical, mitigation measures such as noise blankets will be used to minimise impacts as much as possible.

Vehicles will be switched off when not in use to minimise noise. Where required, any dust generating activities will be watered down. Every effort will be made to reduce the impact to residents and businesses while work takes place.

Construction of the light rail will continue in your area after this notified period. You will receive periodic updates as work progresses in your area and advanced notification of any night and weekend work.

Light rail taking shape in Kensington and Kingsford

Approximately 4.5 kilometres of track has been installed on Anzac Parade between Dacey Avenue and Sturt Street.

With track almost complete along most of Anzac Parade, work is now progressing well on the undergrounding of power and communications services to properties, the installation of smart poles and the reinstatement of roads and footpaths in the area. Work will also start on the first light rail stop in Kensington and Kingsford, near the intersection of Todman Avenue with Anzac Parade.
